TO THE TOWN CLERK OF Bridgeport:

Today we received from the Honorable Ned Lamont, a copy of a writ of election dated March 22, 2019, ordering a Special Election to be held for the office of State Representative for the 130th Assembly District in a portion of the town of Bridgeport, on Tuesday, May 7, 2019, to fill a vacancy that occurred on March 15, 2019 by reason of the death of the Honorable Ezequiel Santiago.

The Special Election is ordered for the purpose of electing a State Representative for 130th Assembly District to serve for the remainder of the official term commencing on January 9, 2019 and ending January 6, 2021.

Enclosed are copies of Conn. Gen. Stat. §§9-215, 9-216 and 9-217 that prescribe the procedure to be followed in connection with the Special Election. Please note that §9-215 provides that (1) on receiving such writs, you are to warn the election in the same manner as state elections are warned; (2) nominations by political parties are to be made at any time after the resignation and not later than April 1, 2019 and (3) such nominations by political parties must be made as the rules of such parties provide and certified to the secretary by such date by the presiding officer or secretary of the town committee. The nominated candidate must sign and file with the secretary a certificate stating his name as he authorizes it to appear on the ballot, which certificate may be a part of the foregoing.

As also provided in §9-215, the party-endorsed choices are not subject to a primary, and the candidate selected by each political party becomes the nominee of such party. May we urge that you notify each of your town chairmen of the provisions of said section with respect to the time for nominating candidates. We are enclosing for your guidance a nomination and election calendar which would apply under §§9-215, 9-216, 9-217 and other relevant sections of the General Statutes. A form for the certifying of the nominations to the secretary is also enclosed.

Under the provisions of §9-174, the polls at the Special Election will be open from 6:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Enclosed for the town clerk is a suggested form of Warning of the Special Election for your Special Election. The office of "State Representative to Fill Vacancy" will appear on the ballot. May we also point out that the heading on your ballot will be "Special State Election".

In accordance with Conn. Gen. Stat. §9-249a, the names of the major parties, if they both nominate candidates, shall be arranged on the ballot in the following order:

> Democratic Party Republican Party

Generally speaking, the provisions of our statutes (such as the absentee voting law, etc.) applicable to state elections will apply to the coming Special Election. The registrars of voters do not hold sessions to admit electors under §9-17 nor do they hold sessions to revise the registry list under §9-35, but they do prepare a supplementary registry list under §9-172a and 9-172b before the Special Election.

May we also emphasize that under §§9-216 and 9-453a anyone desiring a nominating petition in connection with the coming election must make application to the Secretary of the State as required in §9-453b, and any such petition, in accordance with the requirements of §9-453d, must contain a number of signatures of qualified electors equal to 1% of the votes cast for the same office at the last-preceding election (being 36 signatures for State Representative to Fill Vacancy in the 130th Assembly District). The completed nominating petition must be filed by **April 1, 2019**, under §9-216.

FRIDAY, MARCH 22

Date required by §9-215 for issuance of writ of election by Governor; warning of election to be published by Town Clerk upon receipt of writ.

MONDAY, APRIL 1

Final date for submission to Town Clerk by circulator of nominating petitions (for nominating petition candidates). The Town Clerk or assistant town clerk in each town in which the election is to be held must be in his office between 1:00 p.m. and 4:00p.m. on this deadline day to accept petition pages.(§9-453i(d),9-2)

MONDAY, APRIL 1

Final date for nomination by political parties. Nominations to be made in accordance with §9-215 and applicable party rules and certified to Secretary of the State by either the chairman or presiding officer or secretary of convention by this date. The nominated candidate of a major party must sign and file with the Secretary of the State a certificate stating his name as he authorizes it to appear on the ballot, which certificate may be a part of the foregoing certificate. (§9-388)

WEDNESDAY, APRIL 3

Final date for Town Clerk to file nominating petition pages with office of the Secretary of the State so that they are received no later than this date.

FRIDAY, APRIL 5

Absentee ballots become available. Copy to be filed with Secretary of the State. $(\S\S9-135b(c) \text{ and } 9-140(f))$

TUESDAY, APRIL 23

Final date for write-in candidates to register with Secretary of the State. (§9-224b)

FRIDAY, APRIL 26

Final date for filing by Town Clerks of sample voting machine ballot labels with Secretary of the State. (§9-256)

TUESDAY, APRIL 30

Voter Registration Deadline. Those whose rights as to age, citizenship or residence mature after this date may apply in their Town Clerk or Registrars of Voters office on a daily basis until the limited session on May 6, 2019.

Registration by mail deadline. Hand-delivered mail-in registration applications must be received by this date by Registrars in applicant's town of residence (or by Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) or a voter registration agency), and mailed mail-in registration applications must be postmarked by this date, for the applicant to be entitled to vote in the election. Electoral privileges of applicants meeting this deadline attach immediately upon approval by the Registrar. (§9-23g(d)(2)).

MONDAY, MAY 6

In Person Voter Registration Deadline. In person voter registration cut-off. Last regular voter registration session for this special election. Applicants must appear in person. (9-172b(b))

TUESDAY, MAY 7

Election Day. Hours of voting 6:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. (§9-174)

Absentee ballots may not be issued on election day, except to electors who suddenly become ill within six days immediately preceding close of the polls at the election or who are patients in a hospital within such six-day period, may be issued an absentee ballot up to the close of the polls. (§§9-140(h) and 9-150c)

In order to be cast at an election, the absentee ballot must be received by Municipal Clerk before the close of the polls. (§9-140b(a))



- Sec.9-215. Member or member-elect of the General Assembly. (a) When any member or member-elect of the General Assembly resigns, the member or member-elect shall resign by notifying the Secretary of the State of the member's or member-elect's decision, and if any member or member-elect of the General Assembly dies, the town clerk from the town in which the member or member-elect resides shall notify the Secretary of the State of such death.
- (b) When any such vacancy occurs, except as provided in this section, the Governor shall, within ten days after its occurrence, issue writs of election, directed to the town clerks or assistant town clerks in the several towns in the district in which the vacancy exists, ordering an election to be held therein on the forty-sixth day after the issue of such writs to fill such vacancy, and cause them to be conveyed to such town clerks or assistant town clerks. No such election shall be held on a Saturday or Sunday. If such a vacancy occurs between the one hundred twenty-fifth day and the forty-ninth day before the day of a regular state or municipal election in November of any year, the Governor shall so issue such writs on the forty-sixth day before the day of such regular election, ordering an election to be held on the day of such regular election. If such a vacancy occurs after the forty-ninth day before the day of a regular state election but before the Wednesday following the first Monday of January of the next-succeeding year, the Governor shall not issue such writs and no election shall be held under this section, unless the position vacated is that of member-elect, in which case the Governor shall issue such writs and an election shall be held as provided in this section.
- (c) Such clerks or assistant clerks, on receiving such writs, but not earlier than the date of issuance of such writs, shall warn elections to be held on the day appointed therein, in the same manner as state elections are warned, which elections shall be organized and conducted in the same manner as a state election. The vote shall be declared, certified, directed, deposited, returned and transmitted in the same manner as at a state election. The registry lists used at such elections shall be the last-completed lists, as provided in sections 9-172a and 9-172b.
- (d)(1) If such vacancy resulting from the resignation or death of a member or member-elect of the General Assembly exists in a senatorial or assembly district composed of a single town or part of a single town, such nominations by political parties shall be made as the rules of such parties provide, in accordance with section 9-390, and filed with the Secretary of the State; except that (A) if such rules provide for selection by delegates and the vacancy exists in a senatorial or assembly district composed of a single town, the delegates to the convention held for the nomination of a candidate for the office of state senator or state representative in such town at the last state election shall be the delegates for the purpose of selecting a candidate to fill such vacancy; (B) if such rules provide for the selection by delegates and the vacancy exists in a senatorial or assembly district composed of part of a single town, the delegates to the convention held for the nomination of a candidate for the office of state senator or state representative in such district at the last state election shall be the delegates for the purpose of selecting a candidate to fill such vacancy; and (C) if such rules provide for direct primaries under section 9-390, the nomination shall be made by the town committee of such party in the case of a vacancy in a senatorial or assembly district composed of a single town and, in a senatorial or assembly district composed of part of a single town, by the members of the town committee from such political subdivision or senatorial or assembly district. (2) If such vacancy resulting from the resignation or death of a member or member-elect of the General Assembly exists in a district office, as defined in section 9-372, the delegates to the senatorial or assembly convention for the last state election shall be the delegates for the purpose of selecting a candidate to fill such vacancy. (3) If a vacancy occurs in the delegation from any town, political subdivision or district, such vacancy may be filled by the town committee of the town in which the delegate resided. (4) Nominations by political parties pursuant to this section may be made and certified at any time after the resignation or death of the member or member-elect of the General Assembly and not later than the thirty-sixth day before the day of the election. No such nomination shall be effective until the presiding officer or secretary of any district convention has certified the nomination to the Secretary of the State or, in the case of a vacancy in a senatorial or assembly district composed of a single town or part thereof, until the presiding officer or secretary of the town committee or single town convention has certified the nomination to the Secretary of the State. If a certificate of a party's nomination to fill a vacancy resulting from the resignation or death of a member or member-elect of the General Assembly is not received by the Secretary of the State on or before the thirty-sixth day prior to the day of the election, such certificate shall be invalid and, for purposes of section 9-224a, shall be deemed to have made no valid certification of nomination by a political party for such senatorial or assembly office.
- (e) No primary shall be held for the nomination of any political party to fill any vacancy in the office of state senator or state representative and the party-endorsed candidate so selected shall be deemed, for the purposes of chapter 153, the person certified by the Secretary of the State under section 9-444 as the nominee of such party.
- (f) When the vacancy is filled, the successor to the office shall appear before the Secretary of the State and be sworn to the faithful performance of duties in accordance with section 1-25.
- Sec.9-216. Nomination by petition. Nominations may also be made by petition in vacancy elections for the offices of state senator and state representative in the manner provided in sections 9-379 and 9-453a to 9-453p, inclusive, which petitions shall be submitted to the town clerk of the town in which the signers reside not later than eight days after the issue of such writs as provided in section 9-215 and filed in the office of the Secretary of the State not later than two days thereafter.
- Sec.9-217. List of candidates. The Secretary of the State shall provide to the clerk of the municipality in which such election is to be held a list of the candidates of each party for such office by the thirty-fourth day before such special election.
